Objectives and investment policy

The Fund is actively managed without reference to a benchmark

The Fund seeks to increase the value of its assets over the medium term (primarily through income) by investing mainly in investment grade and high yield bonds (which will include emerging market countries), while **advancing the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)** by investing in issuers whose business models and operational practices are aligned with targets defined by these goals.

The assets shall have a positive or neutral SDG score, as measured through the application of the investment manager's own proprietary SDG rating methodology. The fund will not invest in issuers with a negative SDG score. A positive SDG score means that the issuer offers products and services and/or promotes trade customs that contribute to achieving the UN SDGs.

The Fund may also invest a minor part of its assets in other bonds, equities and money market instruments. The Fund can use derivatives for hedging and efficient portfolio management.. Investment grade securitised products and convertible bonds may represent up to 20% of the assets (of which 10% coco bonds), emerging market bonds may represent up to 40% of the assets and below investment grade bonds (non-emerging countries) may represent up to 45% of the assets (no securities rated below CCC+ as well as distressed securities). The fund maintains at least 90% exposure to USD, using hedging to achieve this if necessary. The Fund uses macroeconomic, market and proprietary credit analysis to select securities that appear to offer a favourable risk-adjusted return (top-down approach).

The investment team applies also BNP PARIBAS ASSET MANAGEMENT Responsible Business Conduct Policy, including norm-based screens, exclusion lists and stewardship activities when taking into account Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) criteria in the investments of the Fund. In addition, the investment teams applies its own ESG integration methodologies, which takes into account extra-financial criteria such as but not limited to reduction of emissions of greenhouse gas, respect of human rights, respect of minority shareholders rights at each step of the investment process of the Fund.

This fund follows a best-in-class approach that selects issuers demonstrating superior social and environmental responsibility, while implementing robust corporate governance practices within their sector of activity, and applies certain minimum exclusion criteria.


The investment manager applies an internal extra-financial analysis on a minimum of 90% of the assets of the fund and at least 20% of the investment universe is de facto eliminated based on low rated securities and/or sector exclusions.

An extra-financial strategy may comprise methodological limitations such as the environmental, social and governance (ESG) investing risk as defined by the asset manager.

Incomes are systematically reinvested.

Investors are able to redeem on a daily basis (on Luxembourg bank business days) as described in the prospectus

Risk and reward profile

- Why is the Fund in this specific category?
 The risk category is justified by the investment mainly in Interest Rate instruments. The investor's attention is drawn to the fact that an increase in interest rates results in a decrease in the value of investments in bonds and debt instruments and more generally fixed income instruments.
- The higher the risk, the longer the recommended investment horizon.

Other risks materially relevant to the Fund which are not adequately captured by the indicator are described below:

- <u>Credit Risk:</u> This risk relates to the ability of an issuer to honour its commitments: downgrades of an issue or issuer rating may lead to a drop in the value of associated bonds.
- Operational and Custody Risk: Some markets are less regulated than most of the international markets; hence, the services related to custody and liquidation for the subfund on such markets could be more risky.
