This Fund is managed by BNP PARIBAS ASSET MANAGEMENT Luxembourg, part of the BNP Paribas Group.

Objectives and investment policy

The Fund is actively managed. The benchmark MSCI EMU Growth is used for performance comparison only. The Fund is not benchmark constrained and its performance may deviate significantly from that of the benchmark.

The Fund seeks to increase the value of its assets over the medium term by investing mainly in shares of companies of the eurozone by using a socially responsible multi-thematic process, taking into account the priorities identified by the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), and deploying indicators and targets designed to enable their achievement. At least 90% of assets contribute to environmental or social priorities such as the ones identified by the UN SDGs. This contribution is measured through the application of the investment manager's own proprietary SPICE scoring, as well as the Net Environmental Contribution and the Social Contribution indicators.

The Fund may also invest a minor part of its assets in other shares, bonds and money market instruments. The Fund can use derivatives for hedging or efficient portfolio management. The Fund uses a combination of market and fundamental company analysis to select companies that appear to have above-average or stable growth prospects (growth-oriented bottom-up approach).

The investment team applies also BNP PARIBAS ASSET MANAGEMENT Responsible Business Conduct Policy, including norm-based screens, exclusion lists and stewardship activities when taking into account Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) criteria in the investments of the Fund. In addition, the investment teams applies its own ESG integration methodologies, which takes into account extra-financial criteria such as but not limited to reduction of emissions of greenhouse gas, respect of human rights, respect of minority shareholders rights at each step of the investment process of the Fund.

This fund follows the following sustainable approaches: primarily, a thematic approach that selects companies providing concrete solutions to specific environmental and/ or social challenges such as the ones identified by the UN SDGs, seeking to benefit from future growth anticipated in these areas while contributing capital towards the transition towards a low-carbon, inclusive economy and secondly, a best-in-universe approach that selects the best issuers in the investment universe and investment in companies making visible efforts in sustainable development, even though they might not yet be among the best in the ESG investment universe (best effort basis).

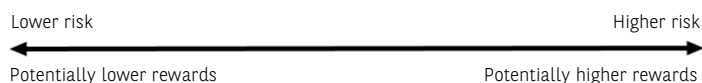
The investment manager applies an internal extra-financial analysis on a minimum of 90% of the assets of the fund and at least 20% of the investment universe is de facto eliminated based on low rated securities and/or sector exclusions.

An extra-financial strategy may comprise methodological limitations such as the environmental, social and governance (ESG) investing risk as defined by the asset manager.

Incomes are systematically reinvested.

Investors are able to redeem on a daily basis (on Luxembourg bank business days) as described in the prospectus.

Risk and reward profile

The risk category is justified by the investment mainly in Stocks and Shares, the value of which can fluctuate considerably. These fluctuations are often amplified in the short term.
