Objectives and Investment Policy

Franklin Global Multi-Asset Income Fund (the "Fund"), which pursues an actively managed investment strategy, aims to earn income and to increase the value of its investments over the medium to long term by investing in a wide range of asset classes and geographic regions to support a steady level of annual distribution with at least 50% of the annual distribution deriving from the income generated by its portfolio.

The Fund intends to manage its portfolio with half of the price fluctuation of global equity markets, but there is no guarantee that the Fund will achieve these targets.

The Fund invests worldwide in (i) equity securities issued by companies of any size which may be involved in mergers, liquidations or other major corporate transactions and (ii) debt securities of any quality (including lower-quality such as non-investment grade securities or securities in default) issued by governments, government-related entities and corporations.

The Fund can invest to a lesser extent in (i) alternative investments (such as commodities and property) achieved indirectly through eligible derivative instruments, (ii) structured products and (iii) up to 10% in units of mutual funds.

The Fund can use derivatives for hedging, efficient portfolio management and/or investment purposes.

The Fund may distribute income gross of expenses. Whilst this might allow more income to be distributed, it may also have the effect of reducing capital.

Benchmarks: MSCI All Country World Index (used for volatility measurement purposes), 50% Bloomberg Multiverse (Hedged in EUR) + 50% MSCI All Country World Index (used for performance comparison purposes). The benchmarks are used solely for volatility measurement purposes and as a reference for Investors to compare against the Fund's performance. The Fund is not obliged to hold any of the benchmarks constituents and may indeed invest up to 100% of its net assets outside these benchmarks.

For the distribution share class shown in this document, dividend income is distributed to shareholders.

Terms to Understand

Derivatives: Financial instruments whose characteristics and value depend on the performance of one or more underlying assets, typically securities, indexes, currencies or interest rates.

Securities in default: Debt securities whose issuer condition has become uncertain and whose issuer is failing to make principal or interest payments when due.

Why is the Fund in this specific category?

The Fund invests directly or indirectly (through financial derivative instruments, structured products or collective investment schemes) in equity and fixed income securities, and (indirectly only) alternative investments (including commodities or property). Such securities and investment instruments have historically been subject to price movements due to such factors as general stock market volatility, sudden changes in interest rates, changes in the financial outlook or perceived credit worthiness of securities

issuers, or fluctuations in commodity prices or real estate values. As a result, the performance of the Fund can fluctuate over time.

Risks materially relevant not adequately captured by the indicator:

Credit risk: the risk of loss arising from default that may occur if an issuer fails to make principal or interest payments when due. This risk is higher if the Fund holds low-rated, sub-investment-grade securities.

Derivative Instruments risk: the risk of loss in an instrument where a small change in the value of the underlying investment may have a larger impact on the value of such instrument. Derivatives may involve additional liquidity, credit and counterparty risks.

Emerging markets risk: the risk related to investing in countries that have less developed political, economic, legal and regulatory systems, and that may be impacted by political/economic instability, lack of liquidity or transparency, or safekeeping issues.

Foreign Currency risk: the risk of loss arising from exchange-rate fluctuations or due to exchange control regulations.

Liquidity risk: the risk that arises when adverse market conditions affect the ability to sell assets when necessary. Such risk may be triggered by (but not limited to) unexpected events such as environmental disasters or pandemics. Reduced liquidity may have a negative impact on the price of the assets.

Multi-Manager risk: the risk that independent decisions of Investment Co-Managers may conflict with one another thus resulting in loss of efficiency.

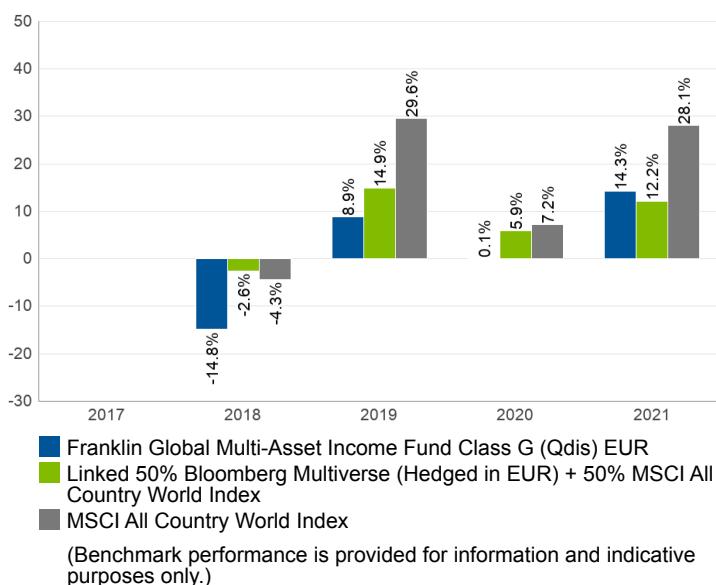
